#### **Guest Speaker: Darci Reed – Grossman Burn**



#### Center

Darci Reed has been the Program Coordinator for the Grossman Burn Center at San Joaquin Community Hospital since its opening day June 3rd, 2009. She is the primary liaison between GBC management and the local GBC affiliate. Responsibilities include

ensuring the mission is being fulfilled and patients receive the highest level of care. Prior to working with GBC, Darci was Director of Marketing for a local occupational provider. Her professional experience includes 11 years experience in workers compensation and industrial medicine. She is a Bakersfield native and a mother of two.

#### <u>Topic: Grossman Burn Centers</u> World Renowned Burn Care in Bakersfield

Since we first began in 1969, Grossman Burn Centers have earned a world-wide reputation as the innovative leaders in burn treatment. Many pioneering innovative techniques which are now standard practice in the treatment of many burns were developed by founder Dr. A. Richard Grossman.

Starting out 42 years ago with a mere two beds at the Sherman Oaks Community Hospital, Grossman Burn Centers has expanded into a free-standing, 30 bed specialty unit at West Hills and remains one of the largest and most comprehensive burn centers in the world.

#### **TECHNICAL SESSION**

#### **Speaker: Joe Ippoloito - Lotram**



Joe Ippolito received his bachelor's degree in engineering from UCLA. He spent the next 33 years working for Mobil, Occidental and two independent oil companies. Joe spent 17 years in international operations for Occidental including Regional Engineer for South

America and Africa and Engineering Manager for Oman. Limited service industry support during this time helped develop his interest in design.

Joe is currently the Founder and President of his own company Lotram. Lotram is focused on designing and installing systems to eliminate problems associated with artificial lift systems. Currently, Joe holds one full patent and four patents pending. The most successful products are the Stuffing Box Optimizer and the Rod Rotator Monitor. The Stuffing Box Optimizer has completed field testing and has been used by a number of local companies. It has proven to virtually stop stuffing box emissions and reduce operating costs. The Rod Rotator Monitor is currently under field testing.

#### <u>Topic - Rare opportunity to reduce operating costs</u> <u>while improving environmental management.</u>

In June of this year the American Lung Association awarded Bakersfield the dubious honor of having the worst air quality in the nation. The San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District (SJVUAPCD) has significantly reduced the amount of ozone precursors by heavily regulating stationary sources in the valley. Unfortunately, with increased population, mobile source emissions, (and to a limited extent) transport emissions, ozone is still a significant problem in the air basin. The District will continue requiring industry to investigate and minimize any sources of NOx and VOC to address ozone nonattainment. As a source category, there is evidence that leaking stuffing boxes of the 42,000 Kern County Oil Producers may be a contributor of hydrocarbons to the atmosphere.

This presentation covers the technical aspects of leaking stuffing boxes and methods currently proven to stop these emissions. The petroleum industry currently spends great deals of money replacing failed packing and polished rods in problem wells. In many of these wells the root cause of the failure is gas trapped under the packing element. This results in a loss of lubrication which induces an element/polished rod failure. The industry has tried to fight this problem by developing packing and polished rods which can survive that harsh environment. This presentation will cover technologies which can be used to remove the gas from the stuffing box, thus restoring proper stuffing box function.
