

Guest Speaker: Bob Poole, WSPA



Biography

Bob is the Manager of Production Regions for the Western States Petroleum Association or WSPA. WSPA is a non-profit trade association that represents approximately 30 companies that account for the bulk of petroleum exploration, production, refining, transportation and marketing

in the six western states of Arizona, California.

Hawaii, Nevada, Oregon and Washington. Founded in 1907, WSPA is the oldest petroleum trade association in the United States.

Bob is responsible for coordinating all WSPA activities in the San Joaquin Valley and management oversight of the activities in the coastal onshore and offshore regions (Ventura, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties).

Bob's professional background includes a 20+-year career in the Office Products industry, small business owner and President/CEO of both the Solvang and Goleta, California Chambers of Commerce.

Bob has a BA in Political Science from UCSB and will complete his Master's in Environmental Science through the University of Maryland in May.

Topic: Petroleum Industry Regulations: Where We Are and What's Ahead

Bob will give an overview of critical issues related to land, waste, water, and air regulations affecting the petroleum industry. Included in his presentation will be a specific focus on the implementation of the California's landmark greenhouse gas reduction regulations from an upstream perspective.

In addition Bob will provide the status of industry's engagement with the California Division of Oil, Gas and Geothermal Resources (CDOGGR) related to a host of permitting challenges involving enhanced oil recovery and other issues.

Various other regulatory topics will also be discussed; in particular an overview of current SJV Air Pollution Control District regulatory efforts.

How can you inspect for the integrity of insulated piping or cased road crossings without completely uncovering them? Scott will tell you how to:

- Set up and obtain data on 400' of insulated pipe in approximately 30 minutes utilizing electromagnetic wave technology.
- Make the necessary connections for the testing using jacketing access holes that are less than ½" in diameter and usually require 4 or less
