There are many more issues the industry faces but I thought these would be of interest to you, and should be aware of. If you have any questions give me a call. Have a great summer and pay attention to those heat illness regulations.

HR 1582: Congressman Kevin McCarthy. "Commonsense Ozone Regulation Act" This bill would remove the applicability of the old 1-Hour Standards eliminating Federal Ozone nonattainment penalty fees (\$29 million per year) that valley businesses would have to pay. This bill would establish a local advisory committee to submit a report to Congress on the feasibility of the new ozone standard set by EPA. Seyed Sadredin, Executive Director of the San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District stated; "Given the enormously difficult standard being considered by EPA, failure to craft common sense approaches will result in substantial backlash from the public and the business community that will be detrimental to our clean air efforts, and will set the San Joaquin Valley up for almost certain failure with devastating consequence." This is a good bill. I support common sense.

SB 653: State Senator Steinberg. This bill would change California's tax structure by extending new taxing authority to counties, community college districts and county offices of education. Allowing these entities to have personal income taxing powers would create long term economic and compliance problems as businesses would be forced to comply with the tax jurisdictions of up to 58 different counties, up to 58 offices of education and up to 72 community college districts. This is Senator Steinberg's answer to the state budget problem -"Yikes" Good news: Last week the bill failed to clear the senate floor and technically died on Friday, June 3 but Senator Steinberg is going to take SB 653's language and amend it into a budget trailer bill (Bill SB 23X). I plan to keep an eye on it.
