TECHNICAL SESSION



<u>Speaker: Michael Mickley –</u> <u>Branch Manager, Safway</u> <u>Services</u>

This presentation emphasizes new OSHA Subpart L requirements regarding ground-based scaffold and is designed to assist workers in recognizing hazards that may exist on a scaffold. The lecture emphasizes new OSHA training requirements for the scaffold user and includes jobsite illustrations of the proper use and application of various types of scaffold.
