Essay Question #1:

Monterey Shale vs. Bakken Shale

There has been a great boom in the petroleum industry with the increase in production and development of the various shale plays throughout the United States. California is in the beginning stages of this boom with the exploration and upcoming development of the Monterey Shale.

With the potential development of the Monterey Shale in Central California, how will the infrastructure of the area be affected by the influx of new jobs and people and how will this be different than the boom that occurred in North Dakota with the development of the Bakken Shale?

Essay Question #2:

Hydraulic Fracturing Regulations:

Two years after France became the first to ban hydraulic fracturing; many states have either followed suite, or are either considering a ban or imposing heavy restrictions and regulations on the petroleum industry. France is now realizing that this restriction is bad for their struggling economy and was not based on proven technical data. Because the advances in hydraulic fracturing have led to an eightfold increase in shale gas production over the past decade, currently proposed bans and restriction have not only operators worried, but the general population as well who will undoubtedly face higher energy costs.

Explain what effects a total ban and heavy regulations on this practice could have on the US economy and in particular, the local oil and gas industry.
