
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- Participate in and direct HAZID and HAZOPS
- Execute EHS audits including: inspect equipment and facilities, document and address deficiencies
  using several internal and external resources based on severity of deficiency, and report completion
  and submission
- Follow-up on EHS audits, incidents, and investigations to ensure corrective action has been completed
- · Train applicable personnel in EHS programs, develop or source new training as needed
- Work with EHS staff to achieve EHS goals including environmental compliance while conforming to safety management system requirements.

This position requires a High School Diploma/GED and a minimum of five (5) years EHS experience in the oil & gas industry OR a Bachelor's Degree in a safety related or similar field. Experience with federal and state health and safety programs and regulations, with strong working knowledge of Cal-OSHA is preferred. A technical aptitude in oil-gas operations along with construction competences is essential. Experience with MS Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint) is required. The successful candidate must have structured discipline for self-starting, scheduling, troubleshooting, and advising with little to no supervision. The successful candidates must also be flexible, able to work in a team environment and possess good interpersonal and communication skills.

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
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
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
