Petroleum Refinery New Source Performance Standards Final Rule: What it means for Refinery Owners and Operators

Mr. Nagulapaty is a chemical engineer with more than 14 years of progressive air quality services experience. He is an Associate of GHD leading the air quality and compliance related projects on the West Coast for multiple clients, including food & beverage industry. He has successfully prepared or managed multiple permit applications with varying complexities and negotiated permit conditions on behalf of his clients. Mr. Nagulapaty's air quality services experience includes preparation of air impact analyses as part of environmental impact reports or air permit applications, Title V permit applications, top-down BACT analysis, NSR permitting, NSPS and NESHAP regulatory

compliance, control technologies evaluation and selection, human health risk assessments, and the Greenhouse Gas Reporting programs under United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA), California Air Resources Board (CARB), and The Climate Registry (TCR). He manages development of emission inventories, dispersion modeling, and air quality analysis reports for new and modified source permits for minor and major sources on the West Coast. He also assists clients with setting up automatic compliance data collection and reporting, which helps minimize manual entry and errors in data submitted to regulatory agencies.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) promulgated revisions to the New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) for Petroleum Refineries (Subparts J and Ja) and the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Petroleum Refineries (Subparts CC and UUU) will require petroleum refinery owners and operators to implement many new changes over the next couple of years. These changes include revised or brand -new control requirements for various equipment — including storage tanks, flares, catalytic cracking units, and coking units — as well as the introduction of mandatory continuous fenceline monitoring for the toxic air pollutant, benzene. This paper is designed to provide an overview of the background for this new rule and to educate refinery owners and operators about the necessary modifications to equipment, monitoring, reporting, and record-keeping work practices they must undertake to adapt to the new

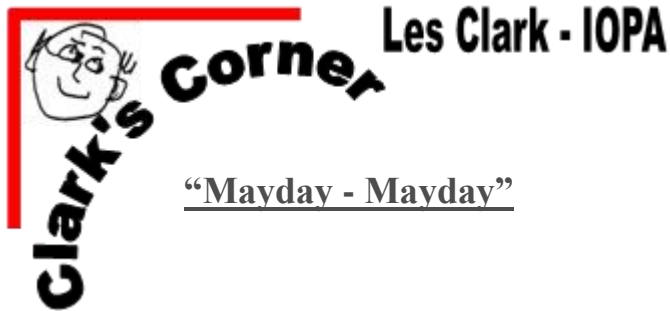

“Mayday - Mayday”

Since the first of the year, I have attended several meetings with the county, state, and federal agencies. I have made sure the small independent's issues are addressed and I have proposed amendments, exemptions, etc.

Kern E.I.R. – Small producer regulations (handbook, fees, pipelines, and permits). For

clarification, several more meetings are to be scheduled. I will keep you updated.

San Joaquin Valley Unified Air Pollution Control District (S.J.V.U.A.P.C.D.) and California Air Resources Board (C.A.R.B.) – S.J.V.U.A.P.C.D. Amendments to Rule 2020 (Exemptions). CARB, Oil & Gas Methane Regulations. I have real concerns with new regulations for tanks, fugitive emissions, etc. I met with CARB outlining our concerns and will continue to do so.

Department of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources (D.O.G.G.R.) – Met with Ken Harris, State Oil & Gas Supervisor & staff. Mr. Harris is planning to request more information from the oil producers, for the purpose of updating their data management system and plans to force the issue. I informed him the small operators don't have the time, money, or technical experience (especially since the D.O.G.G.R. already has the info). I plan to meet with the D.O.G.G.R. consultants in the near future...stay tuned!

I plan on meeting with the State Water Resources Control Board (S.W.R.C.B.) at the end of February or early March in Bakersfield, to discuss our concerns with their Fee Structure, especially the Oil & Gas Surcharge. **If you received a surcharge letter from the S.W.R.C.B., please plan to attend.**

I attended the Regional Quality Water Control Board (R.Q.W.C.B.) meeting with Clay Rogers for an update of general orders for the water ponds. I will send you a copy when I receive the general orders.

3. Academic Transcript: Must be on high school/college/university letterhead. Please submit current or most recent transcript showing courses taken and grades earned at a minimum of the past two years.
4. Proof of Enrollment: Recipients must be enrolled as a full time student (12 or more credit hours) at an accredited college or university. Proof of enrollment must be received prior to disbursement of scholarship funds but is not required at time of submittal.
5. Essay: Please submit a short essay of approximately 500 words for the essay questions and 200 words for the informational question that are found later in the application.
6. Email Documents: Applications will be required to be emailed to all committee members. Scan and attach all documents. Transcripts and letters of recommendations can be sent via U.S. Mail if needed. If it is necessary that you need to mail the application, we will accept it, but the preference is by email. 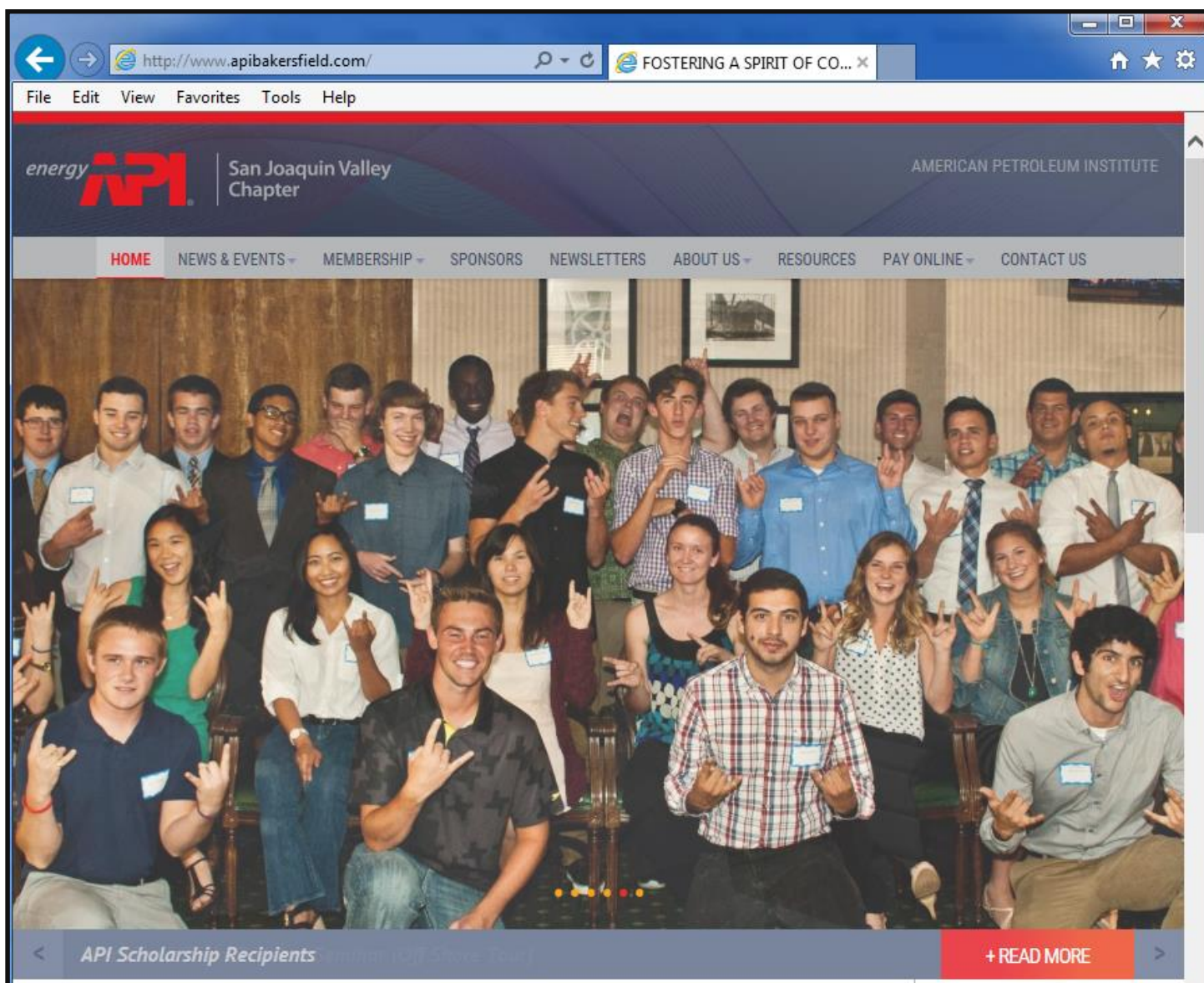

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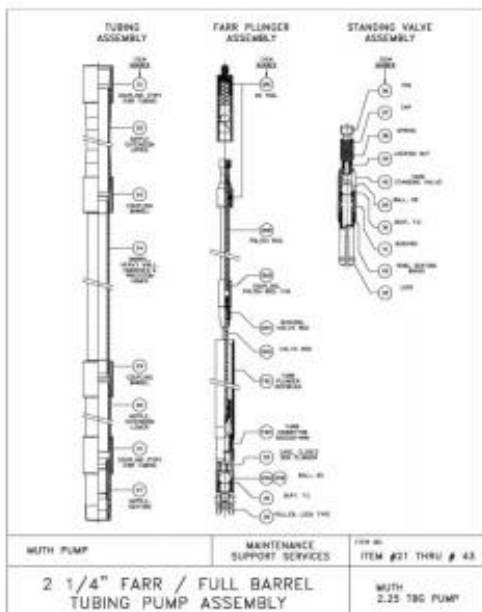
