## Topic: "Director of Regulatory Affairs California Independent Petroleum Association"

Willie Rivera, director of regulatory affairs, joined CIPA in March 2016. CIPA created this new role to manage the increasingly complex regulatory requirements imposed on the oil and gas industry. In this role, Rivera is responsible for the management of local, state and federal regulatory issues

and developing relationships with government officials.

He also serves as a councilmember for the city of Bakersfield, representing Ward 1. Willie has served in this role since June 2013, when he became the youngest elected councilmember in city history. He is the chair of the city's Budget and Finance Committee and a member of the Safe Neighborhoods Committee, Community Services Committee and the Joint City-County Standing Committee to Combat Gang Violence. Most recently, Willie was Regional Manager for Corporation for Better Housing Property Management. He also has legislative experience serving as a staff member in various roles for Assembly member Rudy Salas and former California State Senator Michael Rubio.

In addition, Willie is active in his community by volunteering for a number of local non-profits, including serving as a board member for Foundations for Success and Kern County Homeless Collaborative.

He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from California State University, Sacramento.






### **HOLIDAY LIGHTS AT CALM:**






