Al is a lifetime member of the National Society of Black Engineers. He also served as the first president of the Chevron Black Employee Network at its formation in 2000. In his previous position he served on the board of the Houston Police Foundation. Currently, Al serves on the California State University, Bakersfield Foundation Board, Adventist Health Hospital Foundation Board, Mississippi State University Bagley College of Engineering Advisory Board, and as an Ambassador for the Department of Energy Minorities in Energy Initiative.
