#### **TECH SESSION: Current Tier 4 Final Compliance Regulations**

Chamila Tissera has been with DEUTZ Corporation for 12 years and holds the position of Director of Emissions and Regulatory Compliance. 




#### Dear API Scholarship Committee,

# GPS SERVING THE OIL INDUSTRY FOR 50 YEARS!

The company was founded by Charlie Beard in March 1967. Charlie always had the passion and drive to own his own business and was receptive when he was approached by a superintendent from Gulf Oil Company who asked if he would be interested in getting a rig that would later be put to work for Gulf. Rig One was built just south of Taft on historic 25 Hill and operated by Charlie. Three more rigs were added later, laying the foundation for an up and coming well servicing business.

GPS has survived nearly fifty years in the oil industry because of one thing the company's diligence and commitment to safety and ability to change its practices depending on the wants and needs of its customers. This strong commitment to change has allowed GPS to be successful in a highly competitive industry.

GPS, which started with one rig and three employees, has grown to more than 450 employees working for Aera Energy, Linn Energy, E&B Natural Resources, McPherson Oil Company, Phillips 66, California Resource Company and many other independents around the valley.

The company now has twenty-three doubles and thirty-seven singles, along with a construction division that includes heavy equipment, cranes, welding trucks and an aggregate trucking division.

In 2011, Charlie made Rusty Risi, a long-time employee, his partner and turned the day-to-day operations over to him. Rusty came to GPS from New York in 1979 and learned the business from the ground up. The warm relationship they built has kept the company growing and the company's family atmosphere alive. At GPS, employees feel they are part of something great and the company could not have enjoyed the success it has had without the dedication of all those working in the office and in the field.

General Production Service is dedicated to the future and is working to ensure that new and innovative ideas continue to foster growth with a positive impact on safety, the environment, and the industry.







### Oil Can Do It Food Drive







The Golden Empire Gleaners were founded in 1985. The idea started in a local Bible study group to "glean" food from the local farms and fields that was going to waste and distribute it to people in need. By the end of 1985 they had a functioning warehouse and had collected 75,000 lbs of food. Over the last 33 years GEG has fed millions of Kern County residents. The current site serves 15,000 people per month.

The GEG mission is to help alleviate hunger and provide food for needy persons of all ages in Kern County. They meet the need through a large network of referring agencies, schools, and religious organizations:

- Affiliated Agencies Serves over 100 churches, missions and shelters
- After School Serves 30 after school and summer programs providing snacks for participating students. Serves families of school children at over 115 participating schools
- Harvest Time Agencies Serves over 70 government agencies and non-profit organizations that identify those in need of emergency food. We also include an opportunity to "Volunteer for Food"
- Senior Sack Serves low-income seniors at 24 sites that include churches and community senior centers

Last year OCDI collected 227,000 lbs and this year the goal is 250,000 LBS.

The Gleaners are in need of our help more than ever this year. Three recent acts of vandalism and theft cost almost \$12,000 to repair. The Gleaners are in need of immediate cash donations. Let's dig deep and help The Gleaners recover.
