Chris Wilkins is Vice-President of Majorpack, Inc. and has worked for many years on oil and gas corrosion solutions. Before joining Majorpack, Chris worked in production chemicals and at NOV Tuboscope as a technical specialist in their coating product line. Chris is certified through NACE as a Corrosion Technician, and holds BBA, MBA, and Master of Theological Studies degrees.

Opic: Diffusion Zinc | An Advancement in Corrosion Control and Abrasion Resistance for OCTG

Utilizing zinc, Majorpack's duplex layered coating technology combats corrosion and abrasion. The base intermetallic layer offers ID, OD, thread and connection protection. This layer is a diffusion zinc coating that is several times harder than N80 steel and has increased meantime between wear failures 3 to 5 times. Third party lab testing proved the intermetallic layer is poisonous to Sulfate Reducing Bacteria and Impervious to Acid Producing Bacteria. 




