Jared Oehring is the Chief Technology Officer of U.S. Well Services, Inc. Mr. Oehring has extensive experience designing hydraulic fracturing equipment from his time at Stewart and Stevenson, where he served as engineering manager over multiple globally-deployed product lines. In addition, he is an expert in electric-powered hydraulic fracturing, having pioneered fully-electric, mobile hydraulic stimulation fleets, fueled completely by field natural gas. 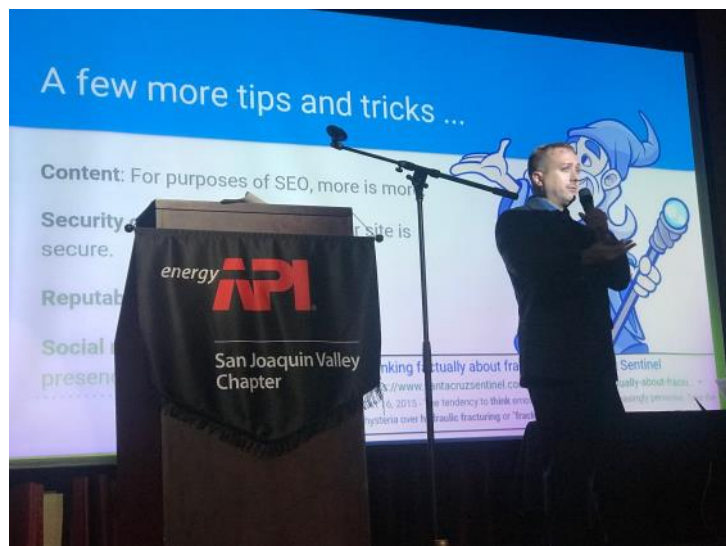

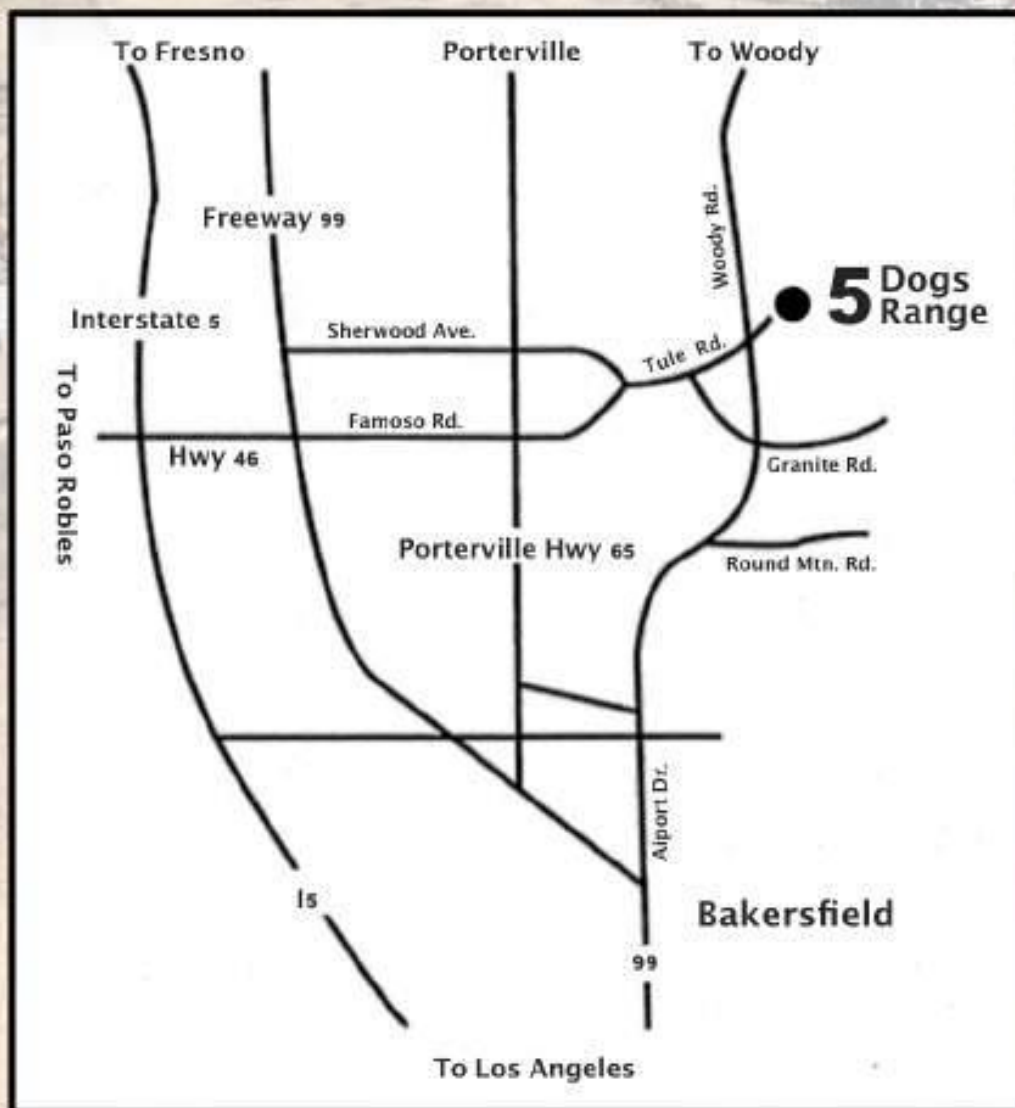

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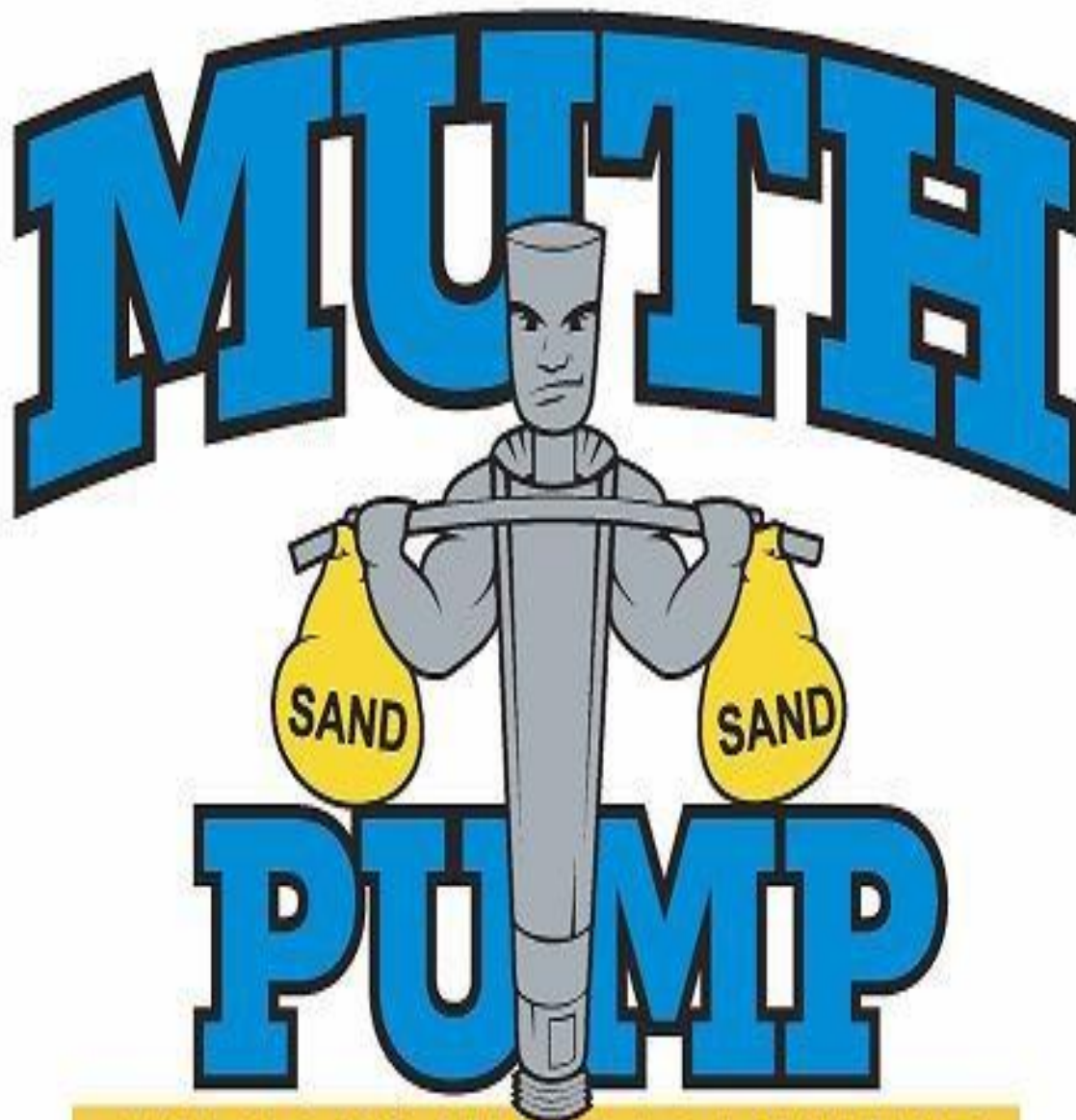
