The Assembly Bill 345 which would have required 2,500 feet setbacks from residences, schools, or other inhabited structures for oil and gas wells and facilities, was narrowly defeated in the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee. On the next page are comments from CIPA (California Independent Petroleum Association) and WSPA (Western States Petroleum Association).

AB 345 (2500 foot setback rule) Was Defeated in Committee

CIPA's top legislative priority this session was defeating the Setback Bill, AB 345 by Muratsuchi. We were successful in defeating the bill this morning in the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee on a vote of 4-5.

The aye votes were: Stern, Monning, Allen, Jackson

The no votes were: Caballero, Hertzberg, Hueso, Borgeas, Jones

Senator Hertzberg strongly spoke against the bill with very compelling arguments that highlighted the fact that CalGEM is already reviewing this policy. He said the bill was not only unnecessary, but would make the current process worse.

Senator Hueso stood up and apologized to the people of California for wasting their time with this unnecessary bill. He was very frustrated that during the COVID-19 pandemic the Senate is spending precious time on the bill.

The bill was granted "reconsideration," which means the bill could come up in a subsequent hearing of this committee. However, the strong comments against the bill by Senators Hertzberg and Hueso are a signal that this bill is all but dead. Senator Hertzberg even warned that if the bill comes up for reconsideration during this session, he will be prepared to bring out further information that undermines the bill.

CIPA will keep a close eye on this issue in case there is a bona fide attempt to resurrect the measure this session.

Fortunately, the combination of CIPA members effectively mobilizing, plus the behind-the-scenes coalition lobbying efforts in opposition to the bill, were effective.

From Christine Luther-Zimmerman, Technical and Regulatory Affairs at WSPA

As you have all heard, AB 345 was up in the Senate Natural Resources committee this morning. The bill failed on a 5-4 vote, with Democrat Senators Caballero, Hueso and Hertzberg not voting for the measure, along with Republican Senators Borgeas and Jones. Since this hearing took so long, they are now planning on having a second committee hearing and the bill was granted reconsideration. Based on the comments from the Democrats who did not support the bill, it seemed clear they do not plan to change their votes if the bill is brought back up. We will continue to work with the committee and the members to ensure the bill continues to not move forward.

We had hundreds of company employees, as well as labor and other stakeholder who called in to testify in opposition. I want to thank all of the WSPA staff, the members companies, contract advocates and everyone else that helped make today success.

This war is by no means over, though our industry did a fine job with its two trade associations of fighting today's battle. Stay tuned.

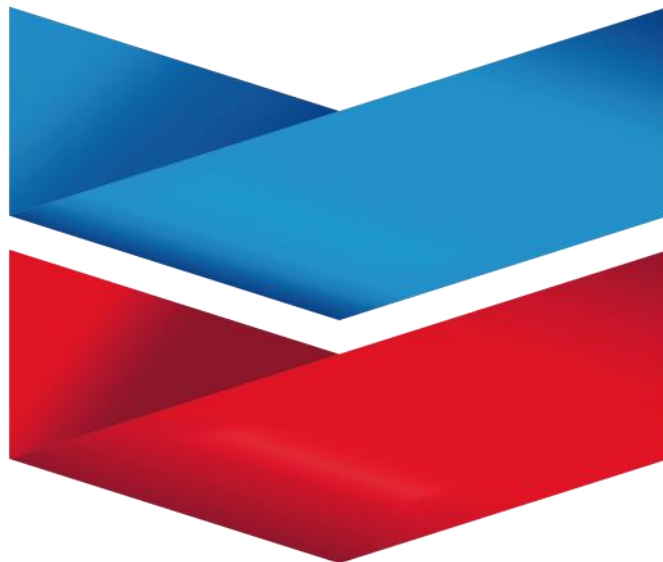
