Pyles Boys Camp has been described as the “Best Kept Secret in the Sequoias.” This award-winning program has helped over 28,000 disadvantaged boys become leaders in our communities. We will take a brief look at the program’s history, what it is doing today, and what help is needed. While many people have heard about Pyles’ Kern County BBQ fundraiser, this presentation will share a bit more about the program, including why President George H.W. Bush named Pyles one of his 1,000 Points of Light.

Bio:

Adam Bell is a native of Rochester, NY and got his start in Youth Development at the most-attended overnight camp in Western New York. He spent a total of 16 summers on their staff, including 5 years as Camp Director. He is an active volunteer with the American Camp Association, and has received regional and national awards for his volunteer work as an Accreditation Standards Visitor, Local Council of Leaders Member, conference presenter and National Conference Committee Member. He has presented Youth-Development workshops across the United States, Canada, and Asia.

Adam believes strongly in the camp experience and its ability to prepare our young men for life. By spending time away from home, unplugging from technology and being present in the moment, boys can become independent while learning skills that are needed in today's workforce. When it comes to learning and practicing the 21st Century Skills of communication, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity, no environment can compare to a summer camp experience.

He never knew a stranger in his lifetime and considered everyone an acquaintance, but often extended that to a good friend. He was funny, quick to offer a joke and be a part of a boisterous conversation taking place. He was just as comfortable in the middle of a church service as he was grabbing a drink at a local bar. He was easy to be around, easy to laugh and considerate of all those who knew him.

His greatest source of joy in life was his family. He was extremely proud of them, which included his children, Jason Peabody of Las Vegas, NV, Christina Peabody-Howe and son-in-law, Jon Howe of Windsor, CO. Larry will be deeply missed during summer swims and living room campouts with his beloved grandchildren Charis, Milo and Asher. Larry is survived by his brothers Roger Peabody of Gillette, WY, Bobby Peabody of Farmington, NM and sister, Dorthey Phillips of Cortez, CO. He was an adored husband, father, papa, brother, friend, mentor, and neighbor. He made life easier on others without asking for a 'thank you'. He will be missed by all who knew and loved him.

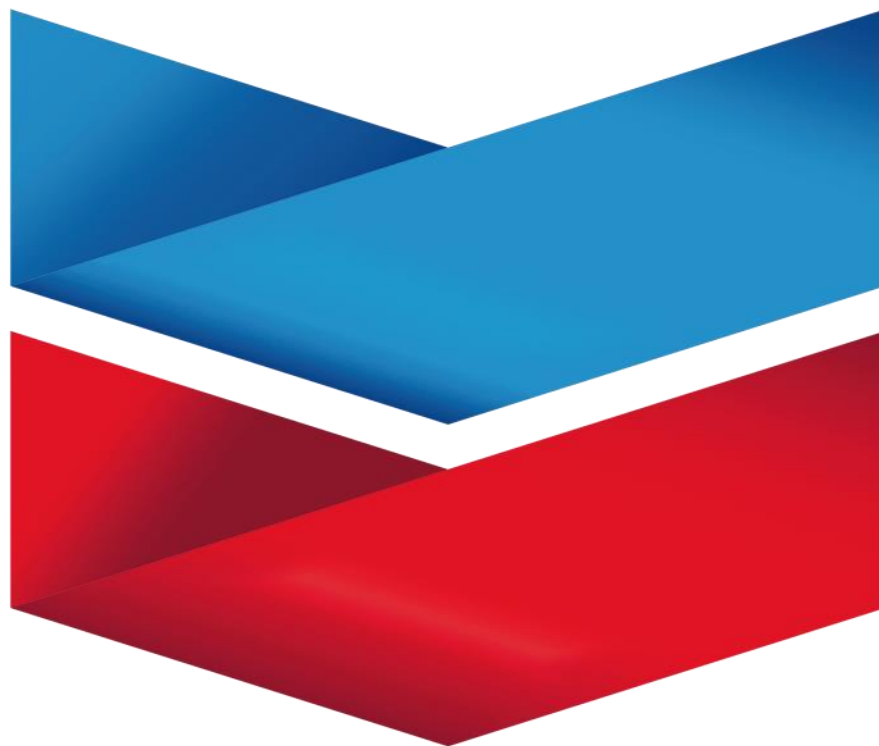
