#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SYNOPSIS**

As a Political Scientist with a life-long passion for government service, I took my degrees in Political Science with an advanced degree in International Relations. My core field of study in graduate school was Middle Eastern affairs, United States foreign policy. Since that time, my central focus has remained on issues of National Security.

Graduating from the School of International Relations at the University of Southern California; I worked my way through undergraduate and then graduate school. At the start of graduate school, I was then recommended by the Chair of Middle Eastern Studies at the School of International Relations to join Analytical Assessments Corporation, AAC, a think tank that dealt with national security concerns. AAC operated in the Los Angeles and the Washington, D.C. areas.

Working with **Top Secret clearances** for AAC, I conducted research, analyzed, and wrote on matters regarding U.S. national security, the Arab-Israeli conflict, and other critical topics. My research and writing focused principally on the Middle East and Islamic terrorism for specific government agencies including the United States Departments of Defense and State, the Central Intelligence Agency, the Defense Intelligence Agency, and other defense and intelligence-related

After completing graduate school, I was hired as a public relations writer on classified projects for U.S. intelligence at Eaton, Information Management Systems Division. After two years at Eaton, I went on to start my own consulting firm to write and produce public relations materials for publication.

I have also worked as an adjunct instructor, teaching political science courses. I have taught at the University of California, Irvine; the American Jewish University; Whizin Center of Continuing Education; and various community colleges, as well as Summit Bible College. I worked in this capacity for a number of years.

#### **2023 SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION**

Dear Student Applicant,

The American Petroleum Institute San Joaquin Valley Chapter awards scholarships to young men and women who wish to pursue a career in the <u>petroleum industry or a closely related field.</u> These scholarships are awarded to hard working, dedicated, and deserving students who are graduating high school seniors or continuing college students who will be attending college or trade school in the fall. When submitting your applications for consideration, we expect students to be straightforward and sincere.

#### PLEASE SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. <u>Scholarship Application Data Sheet (attached):</u> You may organize the information required on the Data Sheet in resume form if you wish.
- 2. <u>Letters of Recommendation:</u> A minimum of two and a maximum of three <u>recent</u> letters. A school instructor who is familiar with your current academic accomplishments should submit at least one of these.
- 3. <u>Academic Transcript:</u> Must be on high school/college/university letterhead. Please submit current or most recent transcript showing courses taken and grades earned during the past two years.
- 4. <u>Proof of Enrollment:</u> Recipient must be enrolled as a full-time student (12 or more credit hours) at an accredited college or university. Proof of enrollment must be received prior to disbursement of scholarship funds but is not required at the time of submittal of the scholarship application.
- 5. <u>Essay:</u> Please submit a short essay of approximately <u>500 words for two essay questions</u> and <u>200</u> words for the informational question that are found later in the application.
- 6. <u>Email Documents:</u> Applications will be required to be emailed to all committee members. Scan and attach all documents in .pdf format. Transcripts and letters of recommendations can be sent via U.S. Mail if needed. If it is necessary that you need to mail the application, we will accept it, but the preference is by email. For any hardships, please contact the Scholarship Committee Chair below.



#### **APPLICATION DEADLINE:**

<u>Applications must be received no later than Friday, March 31, 2023</u>. Post mark must be dated no later than March 31, 2023, if received by mail to the below address. Hand delivered by 4:00 pm to address below. Email by 11:59 pm to email addresses below. Again, email is preferred.

Scholarship recipients will be contacted by Wednesday, May 17th, 2023 by email.

Scholarship recipients, or their approved proxies, must be present on awards night, Tuesday, June 20, 2023. Information on dinner will follow.

#### **EVALUATION CRITERIA:**

- 1. All information must be complete, accurate, and verifiable.
- 2. Recipient must be enrolled as a full-time student (12 or more credit hours) at an accredited college, university, or trade school and be a current resident of Kern County. Proof of enrollment is required prior to disbursement of funds, but not necessary at the time of scholarship application.
- 3. The selected essay questions must be addressed completely. The essays will be evaluated on content, grammar, organization, and originality.
- 4. Applications will be evaluated based upon the factors written above as well as current letters of recommendation, academics, community involvement, activities, and relation to a member of the SJV Chapter of the API. Commitment to the oil industry.

**Please note:** Being related to an API member is not necessary to receive an API scholarship, nor does it guarantee you will receive one.

Please answer the two essay questions below. Each question should be answered in a short essay of approximately 500 words.

#### **Essay Question #1:**

Political forces seem to be trying to end the oil industry particularly in California, and in the U.S. in general. California currently imports 65-70% (~1 million barrels every day) of the oil it consumes via tankers today. Some believe that oil production should be stopped in CA. What are the potential impacts to the state of CA & Kern County, in particular, if oil production ceases? What are the impacts to the USA if environmentalists destroy the oil industry?

#### **Essay Question #2:**

Governor Newsome has mandated that all new vehicles purchased in California by 2035 must be electric vehicles, while also calling for the shutting down of nuclear power plants and fossil fuel powered (natural gas or coal) electrical generation. Given the current demands on the electrical infrastructure in California, is this a reasonable mandate? Are there missing pieces in this mandate for electric vehicles? Can you propose a better solution?

Please answer the informational question below with a short essay of approximately 200 words.

#### **Informal Informational Question:**

Describe how your course of studies relates to the energy, oil, and gas industry and what your role will be after graduation. Explain your intended contributions to our industry.

#### 10 in 2022: Ten Policies to Unleash American Energy and Fuel Recovery

America's core promise – the freedom to be, to create, to aspire – drives the opportunity for all Americans to have better lives and reach new heights. **American energy empowers American opportunity.** Given today's global unrest and economic uncertainty, this has never been more true.

Americans have been here before, with fuel shortages in the 1970s serving as a vivid reminder. **Today, energy demand is outstripping supply.** Inflation is the highest it has been in 40 years. Fuel prices have soared. Putin's brutal aggression in Ukraine has united the West against his regime and the energy he once sold to Europe. It is all connected – and alarming. But a solution is beneath our feet.

Our nation is blessed with abundant natural gas and oil that is the envy of other countries. It is a foundation of our economy, **supporting more than 11 million U.S. jobs**, and makes our American way of life possible. It has revived Main Street storefronts, restored U.S. manufacturing, driven job creation and bolstered our nation's ability to compete. It has made America safer in a turbulent world.

Given global circumstances, it is time for an energy awakening – for the natural gas and oil supply chain and the government at all levels to open a new era of working together to ensure that essential energy resources are unlocked; to encourage investment opportunities and accelerate infrastructure development; and to strengthen global energy security, affordability and reliability.

**Bottom line:** Washington policymakers must confront the global mismatch between demand and supply that has driven higher fuel prices by supporting greater U.S. production. To address the growing crisis we face, Congress and the President must support energy investment, create new access and keep regulation from unnecessarily restricting energy growth. **The world is calling out for energy leadership. America can and should step up fast.** 

- 1. **Lift Development Restrictions on Federal Lands and Waters** The Department of the Interior (DOI) should swiftly issue a 5-year program for the Outer Continental Shelf and hold mandated quarterly onshore lease sales with equitable terms. DOI should reinstate canceled sales and valid leases on federal lands and waters.
- 2. **Designate Critical Energy Infrastructure Projects** Congress should authorize critical energy infrastructure projects to support the production, processing and delivery of energy. These projects would be of such concern to the national interest that they would be entitled to undergo a streamlined review and permitting process not to exceed one year.
- 3. **Fix the NEPA Permitting Process** The Biden administration should revise the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process by establishing agency uniformity in reviews, limiting reviews to two years, and reducing bureaucratic burdens placed on project proponents in terms of size and scope of application submissions.
- 4. Accelerate LNG Exports and Approve Pending LNG Applications Congress should amend the Natural Gas Act to streamline the Department of Energy (DOE) to a single approval process for all U.S. liquefied natural gas (LNG) projects. DOE should approve pending LNG applications to enable the U.S. to deliver reliable energy to our allies abroad.
- 5. **Unlock Investment and Access to Capital** The Securities and Exchange Commission should reconsider its overly burdensome and ineffective climate disclosure proposal and the Biden administration should ensure open capital markets where access is based upon individual company merit free from artificial constraints based on government-preferred investment allocations.
- 6. **Dismantle Supply Chain Bottlenecks** President Biden should rescind steel tariffs that remain on imports from U.S. allies as steel is a critical component of energy production, transportation, and refining. The Biden administration should accelerate efforts to relieve port congestion so that equipment necessary for energy development can be delivered and installed.
- 7. **Advance Lower Carbon Energy Tax Provisions** Congress should expand and extend Section 45Q tax credits for carbon capture, utilization, and storage development and create a new tax credit for hydrogen produced from all sources.
- 8. **Protect Competition in the Use of Refining Technologies** The Biden administration should ensure that future federal agency rulemakings continue to allow U.S. refineries to use the existing critical process technologies to produce the fuels needed for global energy markets.
- 9. **End Permitting Obstruction on Natural Gas Projects** The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission should cease efforts to overstep its permitting authority under the Natural Gas Act and should adhere to traditional considerations of public needs as well as focus on direct impacts arising from the construction and operation of natural gas projects.
- 10. Advance the Energy Workforce of the Future Congress and the Biden administration should support the training and education of a diverse workforce through increased funding of workbased learning and advancement of STEM programs to nurture the skills necessary to construct and operate oil, natural gas and other energy infrastructure.






