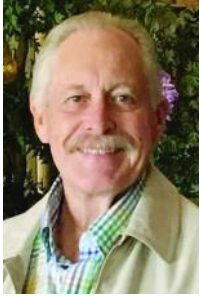

## JAMES JEFFREY JOSLYN April 28, 1946—October 10, 2023

James Swift Matteson was born in Adelaide, Australia, to his war-bride mother, Edna Darby Button, and his American soldier father, Jim Matteson. He came to America as an infant aboard the Bride Ship S.S. Monterey, in 1946. His early years were spent in Duluth, Minnesota, and then in Pasadena, CA, after his parents divorced. Jim's second father, Richard B. Joslyn, adopted Jim and his name became James Jeffrey Joslyn.

He moved to Ventura, CA, as a young teen, and graduated from Buena High School in 1964. He was 16 when he met Cindy, his high school sweetheart, and they were married in 1968. After graduating from Ventura College, they both attended UCSB, where Jim went on to post-graduate school. Their daughter Jill was born in Santa Barbara in 1973 and son Christopher was born in Ventura three years later.

Jim began his career in the Oil Industry in 1970, transferring from Ventura to Bakersfield in 1979. He started Enterprise Drilling Fluids, in 1983 with his partner, Roger Bazzell, decd. Jim ran EDF with integrity, honesty and perseverance. He was devoted to the industry, lobbying in Sacramento, and participating in many organizations of support, especially API and CIPA. Education was always very important to Jim, and he helped many people achieve their college goals through his encouragement and financial assistance.

In his younger years, Jim was a real outdoorsman, rafting down the Colorado, and other rivers, running and hiking, especially in Yosemite where he loved to camp with family and friends. A favorite pastime was fishing in the Southern Sierra with his son, Chris. Jim and Cindy enjoyed many memorable trips, traveling by ship, planes, trains and automobiles (with his usual fun sense of humor), to Alaska, Mexico, all over the U.S., Europe, and his beloved Australia.

Jim had such a huge heart, filled with generosity and kindness, but sadly, it was too weakened to go on beating. Left to mourn his passing are Jim's wife of 55 years, Cindy, daughter Jill Turner (Jeff) of Bakersfield, adored grandsons Gage and Tate Turner of San Diego, Jarryd Turner (Sarah) of Houston, TX, Jorie Turner (Josh) of Reynolds, IL, son Chris Joslyn (Jessica) dear granddaughter Scarlett Joslyn, of Carson City, NV, many friends, extended family, and fur babies.

As a long-time member of St. John's Lutheran Church in Bakersfield, Jim's graveside service will be officiated by our family Pastor, Eric Van Scharrel, on Friday, October 27, at 1:00 pm, at Ivy Lawn Memorial Park, 5400 Valentine Road, Ventura, CA 93003. A Celebration of Life will follow at Peirano's, 204 E. Main Street, Ventura, CA 93001.

A memorial will be held next May in Mammoth Lakes, CA for Charles H. Webb, 64, who passed away on September 20, 2023 in Meridian, Idaho.

Charlie was a well-respected facilities-engineer for Chevron for 33 years, having designed plants in the San Joaquin Valley and Wyoming during his career. He became an expert in reverse osmosis and water treatment facilities, causing others to seek his counsel in these matters. He was also credited with two or three patented inventions enhancing oil recovery. After early retirement, he formed his own consulting company, while continuing to enjoy the fellowship and good humor of other retirees at regularly-scheduled breakfast meetings.

Charlie was most content in Nature. He met his wife of 36 years, Mary, through Sierra Club, and together they shared many hiking and backpacking adventures. They introduced daughter Allison to the beauty of the outdoors at one week old, and her first backpack followed six months later. They looked forward to annual trips to Montana and other locales where good-natured camaraderie prevailed. (Big fish too.)

Enjoying Nature's beauty and wonders, he and Mary traveled extensively throughout the western states, lived 3 years in Wyoming, and together enjoyed the grandeur of Alaska, New Zealand, trekking in the Lake District of England, and sight-seeing in Europe and the Azores.

Cherishing his memory are his daughter Allie Cashman (Bryan) and granddaughter Evelyn, four brothers and a sister and their families, Mary Munis-Webb & relatives, and those many life-long friends whom he held dear. He was especially close to his brother David, another ardent angler, who resides in Boise, Idaho.

RIP, Charlie. We will miss your quick wit and ever-present humor. Irreplaceable.

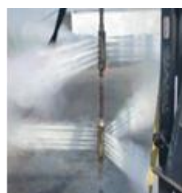
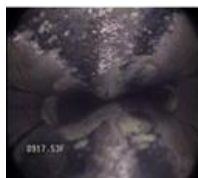
